Fleet Race Meeting, February 11th 2013 SUMMARY

We had a good turnout for the race meeting held at the Keyport Yacht Club on February 11th. At the meeting we went over some of the old and new ideas for the 2013 season. Our fleet racing program is very unique in the catamaran world. There are very few clubs in the area that have a schedule of racing like we do here at SHBCC. We believe that we can make a lot of improvements to make it even better. There certainly is no lack of ideas but we need the members to make it happen. The fleet race schedule is set and includes 13 races.

The message for the evening was one of volunteerism. Our program is expanding in ways that certainly requires many more people to pitch in. I have appointed George Evans as Fleet Race Captain, who will be the man in charge when I am away racing or working. A number of other positions were filled as shown here:

- George Evans Fleet Race Captain
- John Sullivan is the F18 Fleet Captain who will coordinate events involving the F18 fleet.
- Emily Rathburn is our Youth Fleet Captain and Media Captain in charge of video recording and editing.
- Bill Raska and Charlie Capello are our scoring chairs.
- Vic Simon is the Race Captain in charge of equipments.
- Jenna is our new librarian. Once the cat house is back in operation, we will strive to have better access to various instructional videos and books available.

In addition to our fleet race series, we have several big events to host this year. Once again we will host the Hobie division 11 **Points Regatta** on June 1st and 2nd. This is the Division 11 Hobie 17 championship as we expect a large fleet of 17's in preparation for their North American Championships. We will include an F18 start at this regatta and we expect that we may see some sailors travel down from the New England area for that.

Our next event is the **Statue of Liberty Race** scheduled for the July 6/7 weekend. The event will be expanded this year to include the traditional distance race on Saturday and then a closed course buoy's race on Sunday. Depending on the sailors who stay, we expect to have a one design starts for F18's and H16's and a Portsmouth fleet. The statue race is part of our fleet race schedule but the buoy race is separate and will only happen if we run the statue race as scheduled.

The **Bluewater** regatta is on and is scheduled for Aug 3rd and 4th. We are hoping for more participants for this race this year as this race continues to gain popularity. Depending on the participation, we may have one design starts for large fleets such as the F18 or Hobie 16.

At the meeting we discussed new ideas that we would like to implement this season. Four big items that are being investigated are 1) using the Texel rating system instead of Portsmouth, 2) Finally getting a real-time tracking system in place, 3) Having Wednesday night racing with AHYC and 4) Saturday racing. A few people are looking at these issues and will report back at the next meeting.

Another idea designed to help with the instruction component of our program is to meet during a weeknight evening to review tracking or video from the previous fleet race. In addition, we are looking at the possibility of hosting a clinic and we expect to schedule our ever popular learn to sail program. Also, we are always looking at ways to get more members involved and we hope to create an easy way for people to match crews and skippers on race days. Also, with the possibility of Wednesday night racing, Saturday racing and an extra race day at the Statue race, we will be encouraging experienced racers to use those days to help new people interested in racing to join in.
